The Saddlers

William Morgan Gee (born 1823) was a saddler and harness maker. In 1871 he was recorded as living at Town Street, Deeping St James. This particular street name is no longer in use. However, it is highly likely that it may have been renamed Church Street, Bridge Street, High Street and Horsegate.

Could the harness makers on the right of the photograph below have been the residence of William Morgan Gee and his family?

The building on the right, with the gentleman standing outside, is The Boundary Fish and Chip Shop. He states the Three Tuns was lost in the mid-1970s and is, today, replaced by a modern block of flats
